### Performance by KECSS Cheer Team under the direction of Coach Marshall

#### Superintendent's Report: Isabel DiMola, Superintendent

- Opened with an acknowledgment and moment of silence for Flora Ianelli, who was a beloved member of the District 21/31 family.
  - o Thanks were expressed to the principals for hosting the meeting.
  - O An additional update on the change to the reading curriculum was shared. There is a focus on how the shifts make sense for the students who are multilingual learners, with a goal to make all curricula accessible. Team members remain committed, are continuing to deepen their knowledge of this new material, and will continue to be a work in progress as we are a Phase 1 district.
  - o The state of the district update will be coming soon.
  - Congrats were sent to Bay Academy and Mark Twain, which ranked in the top 10 in NY State-- as a district there
    is a lot of pride and excitement around the news.

#### District 21 High Schools Presentation: High School for Sports Management, Leaders High School, KECSS

- There were presentations from the Principals of The High School for Sports Management (HSSM), Leaders High School, and KECSS
  - HSSM shared a video, and highlighted a series of their programs, including their G-Lab which has grown
    in popularity in the building as a space to focus on e-sports. The school touts an 82% graduation rate,
    offers AP courses, and has a focus on doing intentional literacy/reading skill development with their
    students.
  - o KECSS offers a 6-12 program. The principal shared a series of slides on the schools stats, and clarified means of admission given their 6-12 model. Students are interviewed for seats in 9<sup>th</sup> grade admissions given the limited number available. Those attending will graduate with a full AA degree which can be applied easily in many CUNY/SUNY schools, as well as many other private higher-ed institutions.
  - Leaders High School has a focus on small, intimate, student-led learning. Students spend time with smaller cohorts throughout their time in the school, supporting connection unmet by larger schools.
     Instruction is student-driven for exploration, discovery, as part of the Outward Bound model.
  - o Information to the schools can be found in the listing of links at the end of the minutes (if provided)

### President's Report: Jay Brown

- President Brown did an additional round of thanks to the school and the PTA for hosting the CEC meeting.
- Members were reminded to submit their activity reports and reimbursements
- Notes of upcoming school events were shared. The DOE calendars can be found here.



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- O Thanks were shared for schools that served as polling sites for the recent Election Day.
- o Those who celebrated Diwali were acknowledged, along with the fact that there was advocacy to get that recognized as a holiday, which will take effect next school year.
- o There was an acknowledgement for veterans and thanks to those within our schools and community that have served.
- o Condolences were sent to the families of Karen Wang, and Flora Ianelli, two NYCPS members who recently passed.
- A report was shared on events attended across the city in the month, including events at PS177, PS 199, a blood drive at David Boody, and an event hosted by the Chancellor for all CEC Presidents. Issues and concerns around recent flooding were raised for awareness.
- o The 2023-2024 Code of Conduct and Safety plan is circulating and open for public hearing of feedback.
- There were great events in the last month, including Halloween events, gun prevention in Coney Island, D21 Leaders Event coordinated by Council Member Bowers, and UFT Adam Shapiro's coat drive.
- CCSE update- the team flagged that there are reports of IEP services being delayed or not offered, with messaging
  circulating that missed services do not have to be made up, which is inaccurate. A survey to provide feedback is
  available for those interested in reaching out.
- o NYC History Day offers opportunities for 6-12 graders to complete research projects. It's hosted by the Brooklyn Public Library, prizes and advance to additional competitions (BK Historical Society, scholarships for fees and travel)
- o Regards for the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday were shared
