Superintendent's Report: Isabel DiMola, Superintendent

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- Superintendent DiMola opened her remarks by indicating her enthusiasm for the new school year, thanked the school for hosting, and sent a thanks to NYC Council Member Ari Kagan's office for supporting the renovation of the school's auditorium, with the CEC meeting being the first public event to take place in the updated space.
- Thanks were given to those in attendance, in person, and virtually, and to the dance team for their great performance, which reinvigorates our work, and pride for the school and the students served every day.
- Remarks about the Chancellor's State of the Schools address, which took place earlier in the day were shared. There was mention of the implementation of the NYC Reads initiative; D21 is already in Phase 1 of implementation for grades Pre-K-8th grade. The new program aims to ensure that every student leaves with the foundational reading skills to read on grade level, to develop critical thinking skills, among others, to reach their full potential.
- O As part of the initiative, there will be on-site coaching and professional learning provided to all Phase 1 schools this year, to support teachers with learning the science of reading and curriculum implementation. There is also a structured literacy program being rolled out for those in 3s/4s programs.
- o There will be a series of virtual parent engagement events—be on the lookout for news on those this school year.
- o The new Principal, Ms. DeNatale from PS199 was introduced to the community, and welcomed to the district.
- o Remarks were closed with a final thanks to Cavallaro and the PTA, and well wishes for a great year.

President's Report: Jay Brown

- President Brown also attended the Chancellor's State of the Schools Address, so additional takeaways were shared with the community, including:
 - Wanting to acknowledge and connect that 51% of students were not reading at grade level, larger 3/3 among black and Latino students
 - DOE is adding 1000 seats for students with disabilities, opening up more options closer to home
 - There was discussion about students in temporary housing, which is connected to the migrant crisis, but is an ongoing issue that existed, and continues to persist
 - The DOE is looking to engage more with parents, schools, PTAs, SLTs, and CECs
 - The work of CBOs, many offering services in schools were raised
- Important Dates
 - The DOE has shared their calendar for this school year, and for the upcoming two school years to assist with family planning and preparations. Those can be found here
 - There were a series of other important dates shared, which can be found at the end of the minutes
 - Finally, there was an acknowledgment of 9/11, and the importance of teaching our students, all who did not experience that day/national event, about the relevance of this day
- School/Community Safety: An advisory was shared about being vigilant after there was a fatal pedestrian accident in the neighborhood, where we have 3 District 21 schools.

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- o Wanted to raise awareness on the law decreasing class sizes, which goes into effect this year, has a 5-year timeline for implementation, which all schools must comply with
- There will be a cap of 20, 23, or 25 students depending on the grade level; there are concerns about managing this fiscally, and with enrollment as some D21 schools, which rank 5th in the city for math scores, will encounter issues with compliance.
- o There are potential issues with busing, costs that will require us to cut non-core classes, extra-curricular classes
- o Information was shared on upcoming information sessions taking place on 9.26, 9.27, and 10.2 parents were encouraged to attend.

 - o Provided information regarding the opportunity to have students in upper grades, to sit in on live court proceedings.
